

## **Cotton Boll Remembrance – Remembering Loved Ones**

In 2008, our Society worked with Gable & Schubert in Chicago to design two permanent Cotton Boll Remembrance displays that now hang in the entrance lobby of our museum. Each display contains 48 1-1/2" tall white plates, each of which holds an engraved memorial or honorarium. We are pleased to report that the Cotton Boll Remembrance displays have been a big success both in recognizing Bemis friends and family, and also in raising funds for our museum project.



Cotton Boll Remembrances are made at the \$500 level of giving. This amount can be paid in one lump sum, or in ten (10) monthly payments of \$50.

### **BEMIS MILL UPDATE**

Shortly before the publication of this newsletter, Mayor Jerry Gist provided an update regarding the demolition of the Bemis Mill. According to the mayor, Christian Morton was to be served with papers by U.S. marshals for leaving a "Public Nuisance" due to failure to complete the mill demolition project. It was reported that the marshals have to-date been unable to locate Mr. Morton to serve him with these legal papers.

## **Bemis Horizons Endowment Fund: Planning for our Museum's Future**
