one of the Bemis founders. Dedicated as a union church, services for all denominations were held in it at the beginning. The first pastor was the Rev. T. F. Saunders, father of Dr. W. G. Saunders of Jackson.

Then the Baptist believers drifted off and built their own church, now Herron's Chapel Baptist; mem bers of the Church of Christ built themselves a church on lots given by Bemis. Then the Pentecosts left, and the union church was occupied only by Methodists.

Now that the church, valued at about \$70,000, has been given to the people who have made it the center of their religion, a new dedication ceremony is planned for it as soon as some repairs are com-pleted. This time it will be dedicated as a Methodist Church.

A note of peculiarity about the first dedication of the church in 1908 is that its beginning was not recorded on the customary corner stone, because the stucco construction made no provision for one. The "corner stone" has rested inside the church since it was built.

One of the many who will be present at that dedication service is A. M. Edwards, treasurer of the church who came to work for Bemis Bro. as a cashier two years before it was built in 1908.
