Bemis Heritage Day – May 15, 2021

Bemis Heritage Day will be held on Saturday, May 15, 2021, at the Bemis Mill Village Museum which was built in 1921-1922 as the Bemis Auditorium. The centennial celebration will begin to honor this beautiful building located at 2 North Missouri Street in Jackson, TN (formerly Bemis, TN).

Museum doors will open at 10:00 a.m. with free admission. Browse the museum to visit with friends and to view artifacts and vintage photos. Visit the museum's Company Store to purchase our cookbook, coloring book, keepsake hand-held fan, historical ornaments, baseball caps (Historic Bemis and Chat 'N Chew), DVDs of vintage photos, and other items listed on our website. At 10:30 a.m., there will be a dedication ceremony at the new flagpole in memory and honor of all United States veterans at the Bemis Mill Memorial Park located at 7 A Street which is a very short walk across the street from the museum.

From 10:30 a.m. until 2:00 p.m., Bobby McAlexander will display his impressive and detailed ceramic replica of the Chat 'N Chew, a well-known hangout, that was located beside South Side High School on South Highland Avenue from 1958 until 1972. Chat 'N Chew's address was listed as 1624 Bemis Highway in the "Jackson City Directory 1960."

Lunch will be available under the tent on the front lawn of the museum from 11:00 a.m. until 12:30 p.m. (or until sold out) with delicious barbecue plates for \$8 per plate.

Memories of the Chat 'N Chew will be shared in the museum from 1:00 to 2:00 p.m. Attendees will be invited to share their memories which will be led by Sandra Morgan Williams who received a \$25 savings bond in 1958 for submitting the winning entry to name the drive-in restaurant.

Children can enjoy the splash pad at the Bemis Mill Memorial Park and the playground at the Stella Duncan Park of Bemis on South Missouri Street. Games will also be available at the museum for children and the young at heart. Get ready for a game of washers, cornhole, and other fun games.

Bemis Historical Society looks forward to sharing our Bemis heritage on May 15. Anyone interested in the history of Bemis is welcome to attend.

Bemis Parks

Tony Black, City of Jackson's Director of Recreation & Parks Department, spoke to Bemis Historical Society on March 16. He informed us that Amerigroup, an Anthem Company, donated funds for playground improvements at Stella Duncan Park of Bemis. Three playground structures will be installed within the next 2-3 months: one for ages 2-5 and two for ages 5-12. The donation is a \$87,000 project for our park.

Bridgett Parham and Christi David, staff members of the Recreation & Parks Department, will assist us with games and activities for Bemis Heritage Day. Tony offered to provide tents for our outdoor activities on May 15.

Tony agreed to install a flagpole and provide a US flag at Bemis Mill Memorial Park, and the flag is now flying beautifully. A dedication ceremony will be held at 10:30 a.m. on Bemis Heritage Day. Mayor Scott Conger has approved Tony's request for a pavilion in this park in the 2023 capital budget. Tony also reported that JEA will install a light on the walking trail in the near future.

Awards from NSDAR to Joel Jackson & Kathy Williams

Two officers on the Bemis Historical Society's Board of Directors will be recognized by the Jackson-Madison Chapter of the National Society Daughters of the American Revolution on May 15 at Bemis Heritage Day.

Joel Jackson will receive NSDAR'S National Historic Preservation Recognition Award with a certificate and a lapel pin for his outstanding work for the Bemis Mill Village Museum and for historic Bemis. Joel has preserved the history of Bemis through the preservation of the museum, the publication of *Bemis Tidbits* and other writings, numerous interviews and presentations about Bemis, museum tours, and many other historical projects.

Kathy Haney Williams will receive NSDAR's National Community Service Award with a certificate and a lapel pin for her work with the Bemis Historical Society, Mid-West Tennessee Genealogical Society, South Side High School Alumni, US Daughters of 1812, Lifeline Blood Services (donor), *The Jackson Sun* (genealogical articles), and others.

Bartley Garey, Civil War Veteran

Robert Gaugh presented a program to Bemis Historical Society in 2020 about his ancestor, Bartley Garey, who served in the Union Army during the Civil War. Mr. Garey spent his final years in Bemis, and his descendants still live in Bemis and the surrounding area.
