Bemis Historical Society proudly announces the fifth addition to our historical ornament collection. This beautifully crafted ornament pays tribute to the life and legacy of our beloved Dr. William Kelly Smythe. Featuring nostalgic artwork by Mary Patrick Spellings, this keepsake commemorates 125 years of Bemis history — a meaningful tribute to our past and to Dr. Smythe's legacy.

Dr. William Kelly Smythe (1881-1964) served Bemis, Tennessee, for over 50 years, delivering over 2,000 babies and treating countless patients, regardless of their ability to pay. Dr. Smythe practiced in Bemis until his final days and was deeply loved and respected by the community.

Message from BHS Chairman Joel Jackson

Bemis Mill Town's 125th birthday party was a great success during Bemis Heritage Day 2025. Thank you to all our sponsors, volunteers, and everyone who came out to celebrate. Everyone enjoyed our first Classic Car Cruise-In, organized by Wayne Lee; and Bobby McAlexander's popular Chat 'N Chew display drew plenty of memories.

We are pleased to report that the Society received a Maintenance & Improvement Grant of \$19,080, deposited on January 15, 2025, from the State of Tennessee /Tennessee State Museum.

However, our \$35,000 Tennessee Museum Grant application (intended for exterior painting \$30,000 and an updated sprinkler system \$3,000) was not approved. In addition, the annual \$500 grant from the Greater Jackson Chamber's *Visit Jackson Tennessee* division has been discontinued. That funding helped cover the tent rental for Bemis Heritage Day.

We now face several urgent needs: \$3,000 - sprinkler system update, \$3,000 - repair of two roof leaks (requiring rented rolling lifter), and \$500 - tent rental for Bemis Heritage Day 2026.


Monthly Meetings in 2026
